Spoken Language Performance (Electronic Submission Only)
 Category Description and Guidelines

Students recite or perform in Native languages. The spoken language category, as opposed to spoken prayer, spoken poetry and skits/short plays, involves telling stories, narratives and original spoken language that inspire lighthearted fun. Presentations promote fluency, confidence and creative expression in Native speech. Young language learners explore storytelling and dialogue in Native languages and gain experience with public speaking.

Spoken Language Performances are video-recorded and the recording is submitted.

- Your performance can include song, but if music is a major part of the performance, please register under either modern song or traditional song categories as appropriate.
- If the students are performing a skit, short play or puppet show, please register in the Spoken Language-Skit/Short Play category.

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Judging Performances

A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native speakers will judge performances on these criteria:

- Amount of Native American language used
- Ease and comfort of language use
- Presentation and poise of performance
- Spirit of performance

Submission of Entry

We must receive all submissions on or before the deadline posted on the website for judging. You can mail or drop your entry in the ONAYLF DropBox. Follow the instructions on the ONAYLF website. Complete and submit a Submission Form for each Spoken Language Performance entered. Label your video: Performer_Name_Program_Name_GradeLevel.
