Dear Language Teachers, Language Program Coordinators, and Parents:

Greetings from the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair! We are so pleased to announce that the **20**th **Annual ONAYLF** will take place *in-person* on **April 3 and 4, 2023**, at the Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History on the University of Oklahoma campus in Norman, Oklahoma. The poster art theme for 2023 is "**20 Years Carrying Our Languages**".

The PreK – 5th grade performances will take place on **Monday, April 3rd**, from 8:00 a.m. (checkin) to around 2:00 p.m. The Grand Entry at the Opening Ceremony will begin at **9:00 am**. If your students are planning to participate in the Grand Entry, please bring a flag, poster, and/or banner announcing your school or program. Students and teachers will start assembling in the Foyer at **8:45 am**.

The 6th – 12th grade performances will take place on **Tuesday**, **April 4**th, from 8:00 a.m. (checkin) to around 2:00 p.m. We will start the Opening Ceremony at **9:00 am**, with a special speaker and presentation of awards to material submission category winners.

Registration

On-Line Registration will open **Monday, January 9th** and will close **Friday, March 3rd** at **5:00 p.m.** The On-Line Registration System has been revised for the 2023 ONAYLF. - Spoken Prayer in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Spoken Poetry in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Traditional Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Modern Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Master Performers in Native American Language (Language and Song) (3rd 12th)

Material Submission Categories

- Books (PreK 12th) (includes comic books and graphic novels)
- Cartoons & Comic Books (PreK 12th)
- Poster Art on Theme: "20 Years Carrying Our Languages" (PreK 12th)

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Electronic Submission Categories (Posted on ONAYLF YouTube Channel)

- Spoken Language Puppet Show (PreK-12th)
- Spoken Language Mobile Video (PreK-12th)
- Film/Video (3rd 12th)

Guidelines and forms for each category can be viewed and downloaded from the ONAYLF website. Each submission to the books, cartoons & comics, film/video, and poster art categories must be accompanied by a **Material Submission Form**. Each submission to the electronic submission categories (Puppet Show and Mobile Video) must be accompanied by an **Electronic Submission Form**. All entries to the poster art category must have a title (can be the poster art theme) and a statement about the artwork on the Material Submission Form. *Posters larger than* 11x17" will not be accepted. Material and electronic submissions received without a submission form will not be eligible for prizes.

Comics & cartoons, film/video, Spoken Language-Puppet Show and Spoken Language-Mobile Video may be submitted to the ONAYLF Dropbox™. Instructions for using the ONAYLF Dropbox™ will be posted on the ONAYLF website. Make sure add the Material or Electronic Submission Form to the Dropbox as well. Make sure the file name includes the student's full name or clear identifier for the group and matches the name(s) on the Material Submission Form.

Pre-judged categories (books, posters, comics & cartoons, film/video, spoken language-mobile video and spoken language – puppet show) must be uploaded on the Dropbox[™], at the museum or postmarked by **Friday, March 8**th.

Miscellaneous Items

Please remember the museum requires one (1) adult chaperone per five (5) PreK through 5th grade students and one (1) adult chaperone per ten (10) 6th through 12th grade students. Please plan to bring the necessary number of parents or other chaperones with you. Admission to the Museum is complimentary during Fair days.

New for 2023. Students who perform at the 2023 ONAYLF in-person will receive a t-shirt and medallions for their participation. Students who submit only Material and/or Electronic Submissions will receive a backpack or similar item for their participation.

There will be seating areas for lunch available for everyone. Lunches must be sealed in Ziploc® bags, Tupperware® style containers, or contained in coolers. There will not be cold storage available, but we can store coolers in the first floor kitchenette. We will have people at the door to help you with these. The Museum no longer has a café.

In order to promote a safe environment, hand sanitizer and masks will be available for use by your students and their guests at ONAYLF. Please be aware of your students' COVID, Flu and other respiratory disease status before arriving at the Museum.
