Greetings from the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair! We are pleased to announce that the **18th Annual ONAYLF** will take place in **April 2021**, as a **virtual** event of the Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History in Norman, Oklahoma. Due to continuing safety concerns surrounding COVID-19, the ONAYLF Steering Committee has determined that ONAYLF cannot be held in person at the museum in 2021. The Fair will be held virtually on the Sam Noble Museum's YouTube platform.

The poster art theme for 2021 is "Generations Healing Through Language".

Posters and Comics & Cartoons Categories will be submitted as pdf files or photographs. The Book and Essay Categories will not be available for the 2021 Fair. The Film and Video Category will be unchanged from previous years.

All live performance categories will be submitted as a video. All videos will be posted on the Sam Noble Museum's YouTube platform for the month of April 2021.

Pre-registration is required. On-Line Registration will open **Monday, January 4th** and will close **Monday, March 1st** at **5:00 p.m.** The On-Line Registration System has not changed for the 2021 Fair. Access to the system will be through the ONAYLF website. <u>You will need to create a new username and password for the system</u>. If you have trouble with the registration, *or you know of a teacher who does not have access to the web*, please call us at 405-325-7588.

We will have staff available to assist you on Wednesdays from 9:00 am to 1:30 pm during January. The office schedule for February and March will be posted on the webpage in January. All submittals must be at the museum or postmarked by Friday, March 5th.

- Spoken Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Spoken Native American Language Skit/Short Play (PreK-12th)
- Spoken Prayer in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Spoken Poetry in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Traditional Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Modern Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Language Masters/Master Performance in Native American Language (3rd 12th)

Material Submission Categories

- Cartoons & Comic Books (PreK 12th) (pdf file or photograph)
- Film/Video (3rd 12th)
- Poster Art on Theme: "*Generations Healing Through Language*" (PreK 12th) (pdf file or photograph)

Guidelines and forms for each category can be viewed and downloaded from the ONAYLF website. Each submission to the cartoons & comics, film/video, and poster art categories must be accompanied by a **Material Submission Form**. All entries to the poster art category must have a title (can be the poster art theme) and a statement about the artwork on the Material Submission Form. *Posters larger than 11x17" will not be accepted*. Material submissions received without a material submissions form will not be eligible for prizes. Posters and comics will be submitted as pdf files or photographs.

Each video submitted in a performance category must be accompanied by the **Submission Form**. Performance videos received without a submission form will not be eligible for prizes.

All materials may be submitted to the ONAYLF Dropbox. Instructions for using the ONAYLF Dropbox will be posted on the ONAYLF website. Make sure add the Submission Form or the Material Submission Form to the Dropbox as well. Make sure the file name includes the student's full name or clear identifier for the group and matches the name(s) on the Material Submission Form.
