### **Submission of Your Entry**

We must receive all submissions on or before the deadline posted on the website for judging. You can mail or drop your entry in the ONAYLF DropBox. Follow the instructions on the on the ONAYLF website. Complete and submit Material Submission Form for each Film/Video entered.

### **Judging Submissions**

Material submissions are pre-judged before the Fair. Please have the student(s) complete the Material Submission Form to explain more about the video and its personal significance for the filmmaker(s). A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native filmmakers will judge films on these criteria:

• Amount of Native language used

- Creativity and effort
- Quality of video relative to the age group
- **38** It's better to focus on *Native language use* than to worry about flashy video effects.
- Awards will be presented at the film screening, but you don't have to be present to win.

#### **Notes**

- You must pre-register to receive awards. Please do so as early as possible.
- Make sure you keep a copy of your video just in case there are problems with delivery.
