Language Advocacy Essay

Category Description and Guidelines

Students are invited to prepare an essay on the importance of Native American languages. Many entries contain introductions, sentences or words in the author's Native language, but this *essay should be primarily in English*. The Fair encourages students to be aware of the issues surrounding language loss and to be language advocates for their communities.

DO

- ✓ Pre-register online
- ✓ PRINTED: Double-space, 12 pt. font, about 1000 words or 2-3 pages
- ✓ Can be handwritten
- ✓ Email the essay to onaylf.samnoblemuseum@ou.edu

DON'T

- ✗ Plagiarize. Work must be original.
- ✗ Write entirely in Native languages; the essay should be primarily in English

Essay Delivery

We must receive all material submissions *on or before the material submissions deadline posted on the website* for pre-judging. We accept these electronic formats: .doc, .docx, .pdf. You can email, put in our on-line DropBox, print and mail or drop off your entry. Please be sure to include your name, grade, school and teacher's name, tribal affiliation and Native languages you speak (or are learning) at the top of the first page. **PLEASE:** If you email your essay, label the file this way: ONAYLF_year_Essay_Lastname. *For example, ONAYLF_2017_Essay_Johnson.*

Judging Essay Submissions

Material submissions are pre-judged before the Fair. A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers, language advocates, and/or university professors will judge essays on these criteria:

- Goal of the essay
- Impact of written expression
- Spirit of the essay
- Clarity of writing
- The author of the winning essay will be requested to read it aloud at the Fair if present.

Notes

- You must pre-register to receive t-shirts and awards. Please do so as early as possible.
- Make sure you keep a copy of your essay just in case there are problems with delivery.
