Category Description and Guidelines

Students sing traditional songs in Native languages. Traditional song, as opposed to modern song, includes hymns, anthems, old children's songs, folk songs and other types of songs sung in a traditional manner. These songs inspire solemn reverence, bolster customs and link singers to their heritages. Singing in Native languages preserves traditions and transmits oral history. Young language learners benefit from singing by attaching culture to words, exploring lyrical creativity and navigating language sound patterns with or without musical accompaniment.

Judging Performances

A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native musicians will judge performances on these criteria:

- Amount of Native American language used
- Ease and comfort of language use
- Presentation and poise of performance
- Spirit of performance

- Give us your background music cd at registration; we'll take care of the audio.
- You can dance if you want to, but remember that it's about language use.
- You must pre-register to receive t-shirts and awards. Please do so as early as possible.
- Limited rehearsal space is available. This space is shared with other groups.
- Contact us if you're concerned about whether your props and regalia count as "organic."
- Group sizes and performance venues are subject to change based on registered entries.
- Students performing in multiple categories may experience scheduling conflicts. We try to avoid this, but help us out and let us know if you see a potential problem.
