Dear Language Teachers, Language Program Coordinators, and Parents:

Greetings from the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair! We are pleased to announce that the 19th Annual ONAYLF will take place in April 2022, as a virtual event of the Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History in Norman, Oklahoma. Due to continuing safety concerns surrounding COVID-19, the ONAYLF Steering Committee has determined that ONAYLF should not be held in person at the museum in 2022. The Fair will beheld virtually on the ONAYLF YouTube platform.

The poster art theme for 2022 is "Language = Strong Minds & Hearts".

Pre-registration is required. On-Line Registration will open **Monday, January 10th** and will close **Monday, February 28th** at **5:00 p.m.** The On-Line Registration System has not changed for the 2022 Fair. All submittals must be submitted to the museum or postmarked by Friday, March 4th.

We are pleased to announce two new performance categories for 2022. The Spoken Language: Puppet Show will be a performance using puppets or stuffed animals. The Spoken Language: Mobile Video Category will be a mobile video suitable for posting on TikTokTM or InstagramTM that combines both written and spoken Native language.

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The 2022 performance and material submission categories and eligible grade levels are:

Performance Categories (Submitted as Videos)

- New Category: Spoken Native American Language Puppet Show (PreK 12th)
- New Category: Spoken Native American Language Mobile Video (6th 12th)
- Spoken Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Spoken Native American Language Skit/Short Play (PreK-12th)
- Spoken Prayer in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Spoken Poetry in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Traditional Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Modern Song in Native American Language (PreK 12th)
- Language Masters/Master Performance in Native American Language (3rd 12th)

All live performance categories will be submitted as a video. All videos will be posted on the ONAYLF YouTube platform for the month of April 2022.

Material Submission Categories

- Comics & Cartoons (PreK 12th) (pdf file or photograph)
- Film/Video (3rd 12th)
- Poster Art on Theme: "Language = Strong Minds & Hearts" (PreK 12th) (pdf file or photograph)
- Book (PreK 12th) (video or slide show)

Poster Art and Comics & Cartoons Categories will be submitted as pdf files or photographs. The Book Category will be submitted as a video of the pages in the book being turned or a slide show. The Film and Video Category will be unchanged from previous years. The Topical Essay Category has been discontinued.

Please view or download the 2022 Category Guidelines from the ONAYLF website to make sure the submissions and performances from your students meet the guidelines. Each submission to the books, comics & cartoons, film/video, mobile video and poster art categories must be accompanied by a **Material Submission Form**. All entries to the poster art category must have a title (can be the poster art theme) and a statement about the artwork on the Material Submission Form. Material submissions received without a material submissions form will not be eligible for prizes. Please do not send actual books, comics & cartoons or posters to the Sam Noble Museum. All submittals will be in electronic format.

Each video submitted in a performance category must be accompanied by the **Submission Form**. Performance videos received without a submission form will not be eligible for prizes.

All materials may be submitted to the ONAYLF DropboxTM. Instructions for using the ONAYLF Dropbox will be posted on the ONAYLF website. Make sure add the Submission Form or the Material Submission Form to the DropboxTM as well. Make sure the file name includes the student's full name or clear identifier for the group and matches the name(s) on the Material Submission Form
