Category Description and Guidelines

Students who have grown up speaking a Native language in their home or community (first language speakers) are invited to take part in a special performance category that showcases their advanced abilities. Students display creativity and skill using Native language in stories, narratives, monologues, skits, dramas, dialogues, puppet shows, songs or poems. Both original and traditional performances are encouraged. This category recognizes that first language speakers have different skills than students who learn languages primarily in the classroom setting (second language speakers).

Master Performers are video-recorded and the recording is submitted.

A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native speakers will judge performances on these criteria:

- Presentation and poise of performance
- Effort and creativity in performance
- Fluidity of language use

X Have teachers on stage
