Spoken Language: Puppet Show Performance (Electronic Submission Only)
 Category Description and Guidelines

Students perform a puppet show in Native language as a group which is recorded on video and submitted electronically. Presentations promote fluency, confidence and creative expression in Native speech. Young language learners explore storytelling and dialogue in Native languages and gain experience with public speaking. Puppet shows submitted in this category are not eligible for the Spoken Language – Skit/Short Play performance category.

- The puppet show can include singing in Native language but must include spoken language as well.
- Spoken Language – Puppet Shows are video-recorded and the recording is submitted.

- You must be pre-registered to be judged and to receive awards.

DO

- ✓ Pre-register online
- ✓ Focus on **NATIVE LANGUAGE USE**
- ✓ Keep a five-to-seven-minute time limit
- ✓ Use any type puppet or stuffed animal
- ✓ Video-record the performance and submit the video-recording to ONAYLF

DON'T

- ✗ Use scripts, notes or cheat sheets
- ✗ Speak in English
- ✗ Have teachers in the video

Judging Performances

A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native speakers will judge performances on these criteria:

- Amount of Native American language used
- Ease and comfort of language use
- Presentation and poise of performance
- Spirit of performance

Submission of Performance

We must receive all submissions on or before the deadline posted on the website for judging. You can mail or drop your video-recorded entry in the ONAYLF Dropbox. Follow the instructions on the ONAYLF website. Complete and submit a Submission Form for each Spoken Language Puppet Show Performance entered. Label your video: Performer_Name_Program_Name_GradeLevel.
