Category Description and Guidelines

Students are invited to enter original books in a Native American language. The books can be traditional literature, new stories, comic books, graphic novels, or pattern books. This category encourages students in the creation of Native literature, written storytelling conventions and literacy skills. This category can also encourage students to use their language in written form.

- ✓ Pre-register online
- ✓ Complete the Material Submissions form below and send it in with your book
- ✓ Use complete sentences and grammar
- Entries that include copyrighted characters (such as Marvel, Disney, etc.) or images will be disqualified. We cannot judge or display these submissions. Avoid copyright infringement.
- Translations of published books must be accompanied by permission from the current copyright holder.

DON'T

- ✗ Write in English
- ✗ Use food, animals or organic materials (grass, bark, leaves) on your book
- ✗ Plagiarize. Work must be original

Delivery

We must receive all material submissions on or before the material submissions deadline posted on the website. You can mail your entry. Follow the instructions on the Material Submission form. Attach a Material Submission form to each entry.

Judging Submissions

Material submissions are pre-judged before the Fair. Please have the student(s) complete the Material Submission form (below) to explain more about the book and its personal significance for the author(s). A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native authors will judge books on these criteria:

- Amount of Native language used
- Creativity in design and/or story
- Use of complete sentences
- Effort in presentation

Notes

- Books will be displayed during the Fair, but you don't have to be present to win.
- You must pre-register to receive participation gift and awards. Please do so as early as possible.
