A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native authors/artists will judge comics and cartoons on these criteria:

- Amount of Native language used
- Use of complete sentences

• Creativity in illustrations

• Effort in presentation

- You must pre-register to receive participation gift and awards. Please do so as early as possible.
- Make sure you keep a copy of your comic just in case there are problems with delivery.
