Students are invited to enter original books in a Native American language. The books can be traditional literature, new stories, comic books, graphic novels, or pattern books. This category encourages students in the creation of Native literature, written storytelling conventions and literacy skills. This category can also encourage students to use their language in written form.

Please have the student(s) complete the Material Submission form (below) to explain more about the book and its personal significance for the author(s). A panel of at least three elders, Native language teachers and/or Native authors will judge books on these criteria:

- Amount of Native language used
- Creativity in design and/or story
